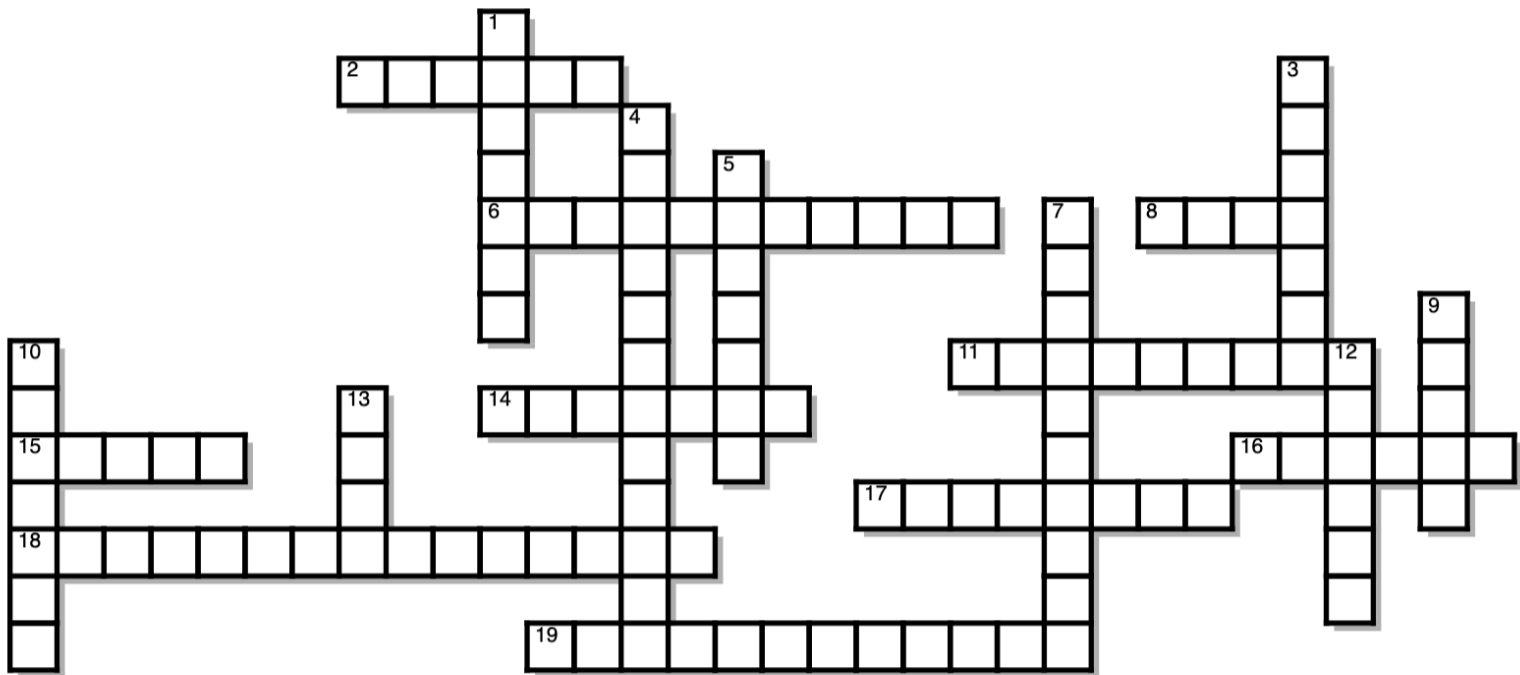




## Head and neck anatomy etymology Crossword

### ACROSS

- 2 The partition wall in a Roman villa or partition of the nasal cavity
- 6 "Crest of a rooster" or Plate of bone rising above the ethmoid bone
- 8 A latin wing or A rim of external nasal tissue
- 11 Latin for a tense part or the larger stronger area of the eardrum
- 14 The Roman equivalent of the Greek wine jar or The swelling found at the base of each semi-circular canal
- 15 The Roman doorway or Paranasal sinus opening in the nasal cavity
- 16 A Roman street running up an incline a bony part of the cranium skull base
- 17 Derived from the Latin passing of time or the bone of the skull enclosing the ear
- 18 Sieve-like or structure that attaches to the answer to question 6 across
- 19 A goosefoot or The parotid plexus

### DOWN

- 1 Derived from the Latin for a small leather bag or One of the two otolith organs
- 3 The prefix of this word shares its name with the ancient UNESCO 'lost city' in Jordan or Part of the temporal bone
- 4 Inflammation of a Roman entrance court or A usually mild nasal inflammation
- 5 A small Roman Sack or One of the two otolith organs
- 7 A Greek winglike object or The name of two muscles involved in mastication
- 9 A fabric awning of the Colosseum or The soft palate
- 10 A Greek shell or The deepest depression in the pinna
- 12 An approach way in a Roman theatre or The entry in the mastoid from the epitympanum
- 13 The boss of a Roman shield or The central depression of the tympanic membrane
